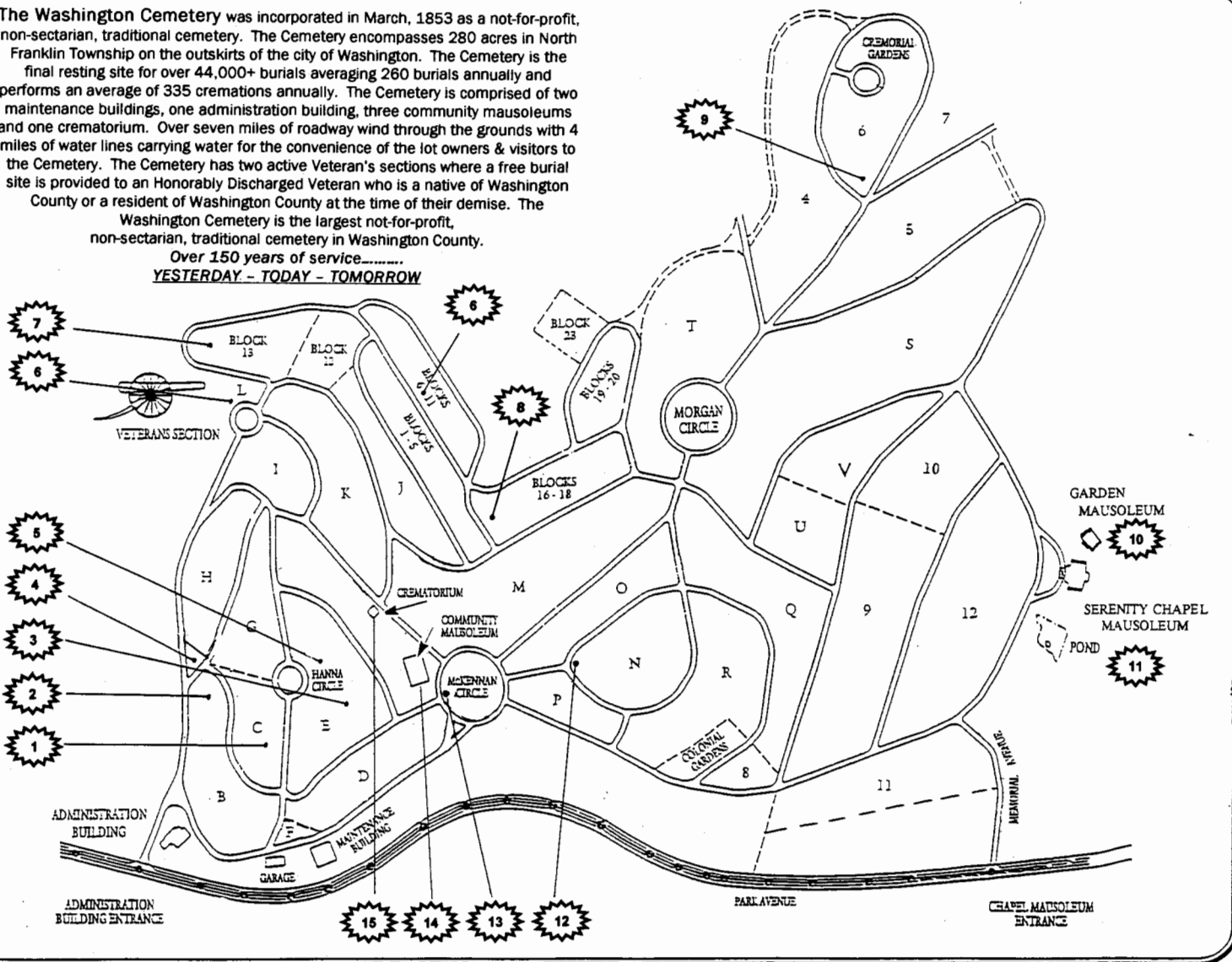


The Washington Cemetery was incorporated in March, 1853 as a not-for-profit, non-sectarian, traditional cemetery. The Cemetery encompasses 280 acres in North Franklin Township on the outskirts of the city of Washington. The Cemetery is the final resting site for over 44,000+ burials averaging 260 burials annually and performs an average of 335 cremations annually. The Cemetery is comprised of two maintenance buildings, one administration building, three community mausoleums and one crematorium. Over seven miles of roadway wind through the grounds with 4 miles of water lines carrying water for the convenience of the lot owners & visitors to the Cemetery. The Cemetery has two active Veteran's sections where a free burial site is provided to an Honorably Discharged Veteran who is a native of Washington County or a resident of Washington County at the time of their demise. The
